Dear Financial Accounting Foundation:

I urge FAF to adopt the recommendations made by the Blue Ribbon Panel on Private Company Financial Reporting regarding differential standards and a separate standard-setting entity for private companies. Such historic change is necessary to effectively bring about 2) more relevant financial statements for private companies and the users of their financial statements (such as bankers/lenders, insurers, venture capitalists and others).

I believe a systemic problem exists. The current standard-setting process does not adequately take into account the needs of the private company sector. There is an increasing lack of relevance of accounting standards for private companies and their financial statement users.

Further, the panel was correct in that there is not a proper weighing of costs and benefits when it comes to setting standards for private companies.

In addition, substantive differences in current and future standards for private companies, where appropriate, are necessary. Having appropriate differences will lead to more relevant financial statements that provide decision-useful information to the users of private company financial statements.

Further, a new, separate body with standard-setting authority must be established directly under FAF and not subject to FASB approval. An autonomous standard-setting body is the only answer to address the problem.

The panel's report is based on a year of discussion, research efforts spanning 30 years and input from private companies and their financial statement users, among others. Differential standards and an autonomous standard-setting body to implement them for private companies are needed now.
